

INDUCTEL PROGRAM INSTALLATION GUIDE FOR MACINTOSH OS X COMPUTERS

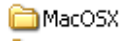
Note: To unzip your "install" file, please use the latest version of Stuffit Expander for Mac OSX. Stuffit Expander versions earlier than 8.0.2 may not unzip the "install" file properly, and you may get an error message. You may download a FREE copy of the latest version of Stuffit Expander at www.stuffit.com. Download the product identified as Stuffit Expander-FREE Expansion and Decoding. Click on the "Download" link.

Log in to an Administrator User Account. This program must be installed from an Administrator's Account. So, be sure you are logged into an Administrator Account when you begin installing this software. After installing from an Administrator Account, the software may be run from either an Administrator, Limited, or Standard Account. However, speller programs, such as the Inductel Medical Speller, may only be operated in Administrator accounts.

Now, place your Inductel CD/DVD in your CD/DVD drive. The **CD/DVD icon** will appear on your Macintosh OS X desktop. Double click on the **icon** to display the contents of your CD/DVD.



On your Inductel CD/DVD, you will find a folder named **"MACOSX."** Double click on the **"MACOSX"** folder to display its contents.



In the **"MACOSX"** folder, you will find the file named **"INSTALL.ZIP."**



Double click on **"INSTALL.ZIP"**. That action will generate the **"INSTALL"** file on your Mac.



Double click on the **"INSTALL"** file to start the Inductel software installation, and follow the installation instructions that will appear on your monitor screen.

At some point, the installation program will ask you to create an **alias**. The alias is what you will use to start your Inductel program after it has been installed. The name of the alias will contain the word "Inductel." You will have to make an alias for, and place an alias in, each account that will use the Inductel program.



Log in to the intended user's account. After having installed this software, log into the user account of the person who will be using this software. There, you may start the Inductel program using the **alias** you created, or a copy thereof. Run the Inductel program, and follow the instructions it provides to transfer the speller file to the intended user's word processing program. Speller programs, such as the Inductel Medical Speller, may only be operated in Administrator accounts.

IMPORTANT!

Note 1: Mac iWork, Mac Mail, and Microsoft Messenger: Before you install the speller into iWork, Pages, Keynote, Macintosh Mail, or Messenger, you must run a spell check in your program, and have the spell checker learn a new word. That is necessary to create a user dictionary and a "Spelling" folder. After the "Spelling" folder exists, you may install your new Inductel speller.

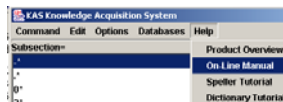
Note 2: Mac iWork, Mac Mail, and Microsoft Messenger: The Inductel installation program will install a new user dictionary named "en" that will **overwrite** the existing user dictionary. Therefore, if you plan to install your speller into iWork, Pages, Keynote, Macintosh Mail, or Messenger, you may want to **rename** or **back up** your existing user dictionary "en" file if it contains work that you have not already backed up. The user dictionary, by default, will be located at the end of the following path: MacintoshHD/Users/*your-user-name*/Library/Spelling/en. The name of the user dictionary is "en."

Note 3: Mac iWork, Mac Mail, and Microsoft Messenger: You must **RESTART** your computer after the speller installation is complete.

Note 4: Microsoft Office 2008: The Inductel installation program will install a new custom dictionary named "Custom Dictionary" that will **overwrite** the existing custom dictionary. Therefore, if you plan to install your speller into Office 2008, you may want to **rename**, or **back up**, your existing "Custom Dictionary" file if it contains work that you have not already backed up. The custom dictionary for Office 2008 will be located in the folder named "Office 2008" at the end of the following path: MacintoshHD/Users/*your-user-name*/Library/Preferences/Microsoft/. The name of the custom dictionary is "Custom Dictionary."

Note 5: You must **activate**, or enable, your new speller before it can be used by your word processing program to check spelling. To learn how to activate it, you must view the **speller tutorial** offered after the installation of your Inductel program is complete. After activating your new Inductel speller in your word processing program, you should verify that it is working. To do that, open a blank document in your word processing program and key in the following words: abrachia, Celebrex, sternocleidomastoid. If you purchased the legal dictionary/speller, then key in these words instead: abbatia, absurdum, abundantia. If your speller is active, it will recognize those words as being correctly spelled.

Everyone, please be sure to view the **"speller tutorial"** that will be offered after you start your Inductel program for the first time. The "speller tutorial" will tell you how to enable your new Inductel speller in your word processing program. If you have questions about how to operate your Inductel definition dictionary program, please review the on-line (user's) manual. It will be found in the "Help" menu of your Inductel dictionary.
