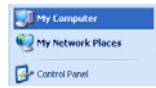


Inductel KAS Knowledge Acquisition System Program Installation Guide for Microsoft Windows

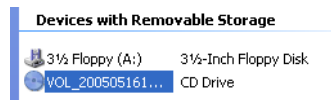
First, place your Inductel CD in your CD drive. Now, in Windows XP and earlier, open the “**My Computer**” item in the “Start” menu. In Windows Vista, open the “**Computer**” item in the “Start” menu.

In Windows Vista, be sure that the **User Account Control (UAC)** is “off” before installing, this Inductel software program. The User Account Control is located in the Control Panel under User Accounts.

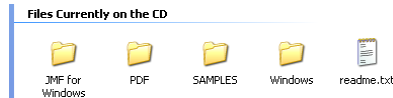
All Windows users, log in to an Administrator User Account. This program must be installed from an Administrator account whether you are in Windows XP, 2000, or Vista. So, be sure you are in an Administrator User Account when you begin installing this software. Speller programs, such as the Inductel Medical Speller, may only be operated in Administrator accounts.



Next, double click on the **CD drive icon**, usually known as **[D:]**.



Now, double click on the “**Windows**” folder.



In the “Windows” folder, double click on the “**install**” file to start the program installation.

The installation program will ask you to choose a **shortcut folder** where you wish to create the program icon. The program icon is the icon you will use to start your Inductel program. You may place the **program icon** in any one of several possible places including the Start Menu, the Desktop, the Quick Launch Bar, or a new Program Group. In the example below, we have placed the program icon on our Windows desktop.



Log in to the intended user’s account. After having installed this software, log into the user account of the person who will be using this software. There, run the Inductel program, and follow the instructions it provides to transfer the speller file to the intended user’s word processing program. However, if the intended user is using WordPerfect in a Standard (or Limited) user account, you will have to run the Inductel program twice, once in the intended user’s Standard account and once in an Administrator’s account. That is because there are two speller files for WordPerfect, a user dictionary and a main dictionary. In Windows Vista, the speller must be installed from an Administrator’s account. Speller programs, such as the Inductel Medical Speller, may only be operated in Administrator accounts.

Note 1: This software gives you the option of installing a speller file for your word processing program. For certain word processing programs, our installation program will install a new custom dictionary named “custom.dic” that will **overwrite** the existing custom dictionary. Therefore, if you plan to install your speller into Microsoft Access 2000 through 2003, Microsoft Excel 2000 through 2003, Microsoft Outlook 2000 through 2003, Microsoft PowerPoint 2000 through 2003, or Microsoft Works, you may want to **rename** or **back up** your existing “custom.dic” file if it contains work that you have not already backed up.

Note 2: You must **activate**, or enable, your new speller before it can be used by your word processing program to check spelling. To learn how to activate it, you must view the **speller tutorial** offered after the installation of your Inductel program is complete. After activating your new Inductel speller in your word processing program, you should verify that it is working. To do that, open a blank document in your word processing program and key in the following words: abrachia, Celebrex, sternocleidomastoid. If you purchased the legal dictionary/speller, then key in these words instead: abbatia, absurdum, abundanti. If your speller is active, it will recognize those words as being correctly spelled.
